

Sakaiminato | Japan

With its pleasing trove of fish markets and world-class restaurants, Sakaiminato is the perfect place to savor the day's fresh catch, especially crab and Bluefin tuna. Stretch your sea legs amid the blooming acres of Tottori Hanakairo Flower Park, and enjoy a visit to Izumo Ōyashiro, one of Japan's oldest and most important Shinto shrines.

Busan | South Korea

Ancient culture and modern life come together seamlessly in South Korea's second-largest city. Discover Busan's deep harbor and wide beach, and revel in its fusion of time-honored heritage and chic energy. Browse the bustling Gukje Market, learn about temple life from a Buddhist monk or partake in a Korean Tea Ceremony, a cherished tradition.

Kitakyushu | Japan

Kitakyushu is best seen from its winding seaside promenade at Moji Port, an area rich with shops, restaurants and museums. Hiroshima | Japan

Hiroshima's monuments and memorials serve as legacies to those lost and as poignant symbols of future peace. Pay tribute to the indomitable will of the human spirit at Peace Memorial Park, or step back in time at the castle of Hiroshima-jō, rebuilt in 1958. The city also boasts a thriving food scene, including *okonomiyaki*, a savory pancake fried to perfection and drizzled with sauce.

Takamatsu | Japan

From its 16th-century castle ruins to breathtaking botanical wonders, the old castle town of Takamatsu combines fascinating history with a vivacious culture. Stroll through an exquisite Japanese-style garden, or learn to create Sanuki udon, plump noodles topped with lime, ginger, scallions and a hint of soy.

Kobe | Japan

Kobe delights all who visit with its spectacular temples and shrines, palaces and castles of emperors, and streets lined with shops and restaurants. Treat your discerning palate to the great culinary offering of Japanese Kobe beef, and follow the storied path of foreign merchants through narrow lanes. Kobe is also the gateway to Kyoto, Japan's former imperial capital, where Zen gardens, wooden tea-houses and geisha offer insight into the Japan of folklore and myth.

Shimizu | Japan

Springtime in Japan - A Glorious Season

Celebrating life and new beginnings, spring is the most glorious season in Japan. Plum trees offer the first sign of spring in February, when their boughs burst with fragrant pink and purple blossoms. From March to April, a swath of pink cherry blossoms carves a path through the country. Both inspire *hanami*, flower-watching parties, often sake-filled and lasting long into the night. A variety of *sansai*, literally translated as *mountain vegetables*, also are signs of spring. Fresh bamboo shoots are the most popular of the *sansai*. Even their name, *takenoko*, or “child of bamboo,” upholds the theme of new life. A special tea makes an appearance during this time of year. In early spring, farmers pluck tender tea leaves to make *shincha*, the sweet, grassy tea of the season’s first flush. Springtime in Japan has its own sounds, too. Schoolyards buzz with excitement as the school year starts, and cheers and chants fill major-league stadiums and high school bleachers as baseball, Japan’s most popular sport, gets underway. But it is the song of the *uguisu*, the Japanese bush warbler, that traditionally heralds spring’s arrival. Some traditions, though, transcend the seasons. It is always the right time of the year to participate in the graceful ritual of the tea ceremony, meditate in a Zen garden or connect with nature in an *onsen*, or hot spring.
