DISCOVERY

Highlights of Kraków. View the castle’s arcaded courtyards, and step inside Wawel Cathedral to see royal sarcophagi. Cross Market Square to see St. Mary’s Basilica, which houses an exquisite altarpiece. Then browse the stalls of Cloth Hall, and trace the steps of Copernicus at Collegium Maius.

Wieliczka Salt Mine. Discover the secrets of the Wieliczka Salt Mine, a labyrinth of tunnels where incredible statues, monuments, and altarpieces have been sculpted from salt blocks.

Polish Flavors. Enjoy a traditional Polish dinner and folkloric performance.

Ojców National Park. Descend into a valley of breathtaking beauty, and see Tolkien-esque limestone formations, including Hercules’ Club. Visit Pieskowa Skala Castle, a Renaissance wonder.

Choice of Excursions. Choose one of these fascinating excursions:

Auschwitz. At Poland’s first concentration camp, witness powerful exhibits and stark living quarters. Continue to Birkenau, known as Auschwitz II, a site that once held one hundred thousand prisoners.

Nowa Huta. Created as an attempt to reshape Polish society, this district was once a center of revolution and resistance. Explore the area, and visit an apartment to learn more about the communist period.

Wonders of Warsaw. Journey by train to Warsaw. Travel along Old Town’s Royal Route, see St. Anne’s Church and witness the bronze Chopin statue recast from its original mold. Then see the Warsaw Ghetto Monument and view two-time Nobel Laureate Madame Curie’s reconstructed former home and the splendid Royal Castle.

Warsaw Uprising. Visit the Warsaw Uprising Museum, and learn how the intended three-day rebellion turned into an intense, deadly battle as the Home Army fought to claim back Warsaw.

A Walk into Kazimierz. This storied Jewish Quarter features many scenes from Spielberg’s Schindler’s List. Visit Wolnica Square, and see the Schindler museum that chronicles life in Kraków before and around World War II.

ENRICHMENT

Historical Heritage of Kraków. Join a local expert and hear stories of its turbulent past and present-day role as a living museum of historic architecture.


Poles—Citizens of the World. With a local lecturer, discover the cultural contributions of Poland’s most famous residents and their impact on the world beyond their home country’s borders.
