DISCOVERY

Edinburgh Castle. Perched high above the Scottish capital is Edinburgh Castle. This strategically advantageous spot has been inhabited since the Iron Age, when a primitive hill fort was built. The imposing castle you see today is largely from the 16th century. Tour the castle and learn how its history is intertwined with the country's history.

Royal Residences. Step aboard the Royal Yacht Britannia, which was Queen Elizabeth's floating palace for the latter half of the 20th century. It sailed on 968 state visits and served as a retreat for the royal family. Decommissioned in 1997, the ship now is berthed in the country where it was built. Visit the Palace of Holyroodhouse, the official royal residence in Scotland. See the State Apartments, the Great Gallery and more. Enjoy lunch on the palace grounds.

Loch Lomond and the Trossachs. Visit the town of Luss by Loch Lomond. Originally built for workers at the nearby slate quarries, Luss has a collection of quaint cottages built with local slate. Then enjoy a scenic drive to Balloch, where you will embark on a pleasant cruise of Loch Lomond.

Scottish Borders and Rosslyn Chapel. Travel through the scenic rolling hills of the Scottish Borders, the region that borders England. Visit Traquair House, home of the Stuart Clan since 1491. This elegant country home is Scotland's oldest inhabited house. Tour the house and enjoy a tasting of the three ales brewed in the 300-year-old Traquair House Brewery. Visit the charming town of Peebles for lunch on your own. Continue to Rosslyn Chapel, a 15th-century church propelled to fame by the novel "The Da Vinci Code." See the unique and mysterious carvings, and learn about the legends associated with the chapel.

St Andrews. Explore St Andrews' medieval castle ruins, dramatically poised at the edge of the sea. Envision the scale and majesty of 12th-century St Andrews Cathedral from its Gothic remains. See the hallowed turf of the Old Course, where golf has been played since the 15th century.

ENRICHMENT

The Story of the Kilt. Visit a kilt maker on Edinburgh's Royal Mile to learn about tartan and the art of designing this unique national textile.

Scotland Today. Discuss the issues and current events shaping the country.
